

## **SUBSCRIPTIONS 2019**

A reminder to all members that subscriptions for 2019 are due by the end of December 2018 – please send your renewal subscription to our treasurer (Jean Lindsay).

### **FULL MEMBERSHIP**

The subscription for Full membership to the Darlington Beekeepers Association is £35 per annum. From this, £2 covers the basic BDI insurance cover for up to 3 colonies, £22 is sent to the YBKA which covers the YBKA subscription of £3 and the BBKA subscription of £19. This ensures that all our full members achieve full affiliation to both associations. Hence full members are eligible to all the benefits available (see below). Through this affiliation each full member of DBKA is then covered for 3rd Party Public Liability Insurance (which covers all beekeeping activities in the UK and has a £5m limit of liability).

### **PARTNER MEMBERSHIP**

For husbands & wives or partners both wishing to be fully active in all aspects of Beekeeping there is the option of registering one as a 'Partner' member for £25 (provided the other is a 'Full' member and both are resident at the same address).

### **FRIEND**

Please note that this category of membership is applicable to new members who are in their first year and who wish to learn a little more about beekeeping but who do not yet possess bees. It is also available for members who are already members of another association or YBKA District and partners of full members who live at the same address but who do not need individual insurance. FRIENDSHIP MEMBERSHIP (£10 per annum) CAN BE UPGRADED AT ANY TIME BY SIMPLY PAYING THE BALANCE i.e an extra £25 upgrades to Full membership. Our basic rule is that if you have bees then you should register as a FULL member either with the DBKA or another association or YBKA District.

### **BEE DISEASES INSURANCE (BDI).**

Included in your full subscription is the £2 pa subscription, which provides B.D.I. cover. This protects members for loss of equipment in cases where EFB (European Foul Brood) and AFB (American Foul Brood) are diagnosed in your Apiary. This basic cover insures 1 – 3 colonies. If you wish to insure more colonies the extra premiums payable are provided below – please clearly state on your renewal form the number of extra colonies you wish covered and add the appropriate amount to your subscription cheque.

**PLEASE NOTE: THE NUMBER OF COLONIES STATED MUST BE THE MAXIMUM ANTICIPATED COLONIES YOU BELIEVE YOU WILL POSSESS THROUGHOUT 2019.**

Up to 5 colonies (including the basic three) an additional £2.00

Up to 10 colonies (including the basic three) an additional £5.25

Up to 15 colonies (including the basic three) an additional £7.75

Up to 20 colonies (including the basic three) an additional £9.50

Up to 25 colonies (including the basic three) an additional £11.10
